
"Irony" is a literary technique by which, through characterization or plot, the writer indicates something <u>opposite</u> to that which is stated or expected



For Example... 3 Types of Irony

Rhetorical (verbal) Irony	You look thrilled!	—saying the opposite of what is meant. Writer may use this method to reveal a character's weaknesses, prejudices, etc.
Dramatic, Tragic, or Situation Irony	Great day fo a drive!	—reader knows more about situation than the character—giving a statement a second meaning for the reader
Cosmic (fate) Irony	Olympic swimmer drowns in bathtub	-destiny controls man's fate—where man has little influence or significance—a soldier returns from war and is killed in a car accident, etc.
